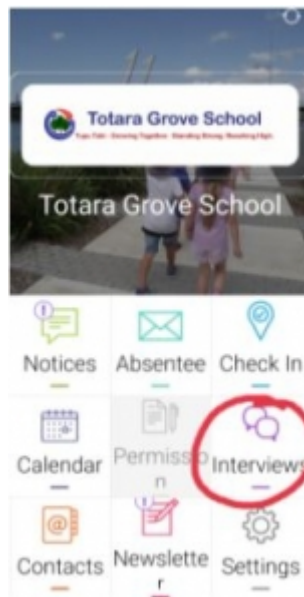

For enrolment interviews will be Thursday 15 August between 9:30am and 12:00 noon.</p> <p>Before you come to the interview, you will have completed the online enrolment and e-signature forms which can be located on the Kamo Intermediate web site. The enrolment form is now online.</p> <p>Character Classes: Information about the character classes will be shared during our Open Evening and also in our Online Programme. We have a limited number of places in our Character Classes. To select students, we use a ballot system. Students and their family who have indicated through the online enrolment that they would like to be considered for a place in a Character Class will be required to submit a letter written by the student stating why they would like to be considered for a place in a particular character class. They can bring the letter with them for the enrolment interview. Once suitability is ascertained, from the letter and discussions with primary schools, we will ballot. The reason for the letter is that we have found during the past two years a number of students have indicated to want to go to a character class but other influences (friends, parents), e.g. Sports Class students do need to have at least an interest in sport.
