





Measles Case in Northland: Awareness for Families and Caregivers

As you may have read in the media, someone from Northland has recently been diagnosed with measies. The local public health service is in the process of tracing any exposed contacts from this case within Northland. At this time, we are uncertain about the source of this infection, and there may be other cases of measles in our community.

The public health service will advise any organisation where there has been an exposure to measiles, and if needed, these will be publicised through media alerts.

Over the next few weeks, we ask that parents and caregivers please take note of the signs and symptoms of measles.

Meastes is infectious, so if you or your whithau develop any of these symptoms, please phone your doctor or after-hours clinic before attending. You can also ring Healthine on 0800 611 116 for advice anytime; interpreters are available.

Measles key signs and symptoms

- The illness often begins with fever, cough, runny nose and conjunctivitis (pink, watery and sore eyes), which can last for 2-4 days.
- A red and spotty rash then appears 2-4 days after the first symptoms, beginning at the hartine and gradually spreading down the body to the arms and legs. The rash lasts for up to one week.



The factsheet included provides more information about measles. MMR vaccination provides escellent protection against measles, which can be a serious illness.
