Last week, our kura had the privilege of Riripeti Totoro from the Ministry of Education, attend our teacher hui to share with us the whakapapa around Te Mātaiaho, the refreshed New Zealand curriculum. I look forward to sharing this whakapapa with you all in our newsletters. There are seven parts to this in total and the first two parts are Mātairangi and Mātainuku.

Mātairangi ~ The guiding kaupapa. Mātairangi is the overarching kaupapa that expresses the centrality of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and its principles and New Zealand's vision for education. *Mātai ki te rangi, homai te kauhau wānanga ki uta, ka whiti he ora. I look beyond the horizon, and draw near the bodies of knowledge that will take us into the future.* 

Mātainuku ~ Creating a foundation. Mātainuku encompasses the purpose of the curriculum, and its principles and their associated calls to action. *Mātai ki te whenua, ka tiritiria, ka poupoua. Ground and nurture the learnings.* 

I would like to thank everyone for the wonderful participation we had for Pink Shirt day. We really appreciated our school community's support and the Northern Advocate reporters remarked on what a wonderful atmosphere we had here. Thank you to Whaea Aimee and her team of helpers for all of the mahi done around organising this day. As a kura, we are passionate about preventing bullying and we are continuing to work alongside Tikipunga High School, Tikipunga Primary and Te Kura o Otangarei with our KiVa bullying prevention programme.

### Seesaw

As mentioned in the last newsletter our kura is using *Seesaw* to share your child's learning journey with you. The Seesaw App gives students the ability to record their learning in many formats (photo, video, voice etc) and share it with their parents, caregivers and extended family in real time – sometimes even as the learning is occurring. Essentially Seesaw is student-driven digital portfolios. Your child/ren's work is kept private and is only viewed by you and their class/teacher.

Every student is now set up on Seesaw and Totara Grove School will be using the Seesaw app for our school reports so that we can better capture the work and levels attained and displayed by your tamariki as they progress through their learning journey.

Seesaw requires an invite from your child's teacher in order to sign up. These are currently being sent out over this week. If you have not received an invite QR code or link, contact your child's teacher.

#### **Community Notices**

We are supporting Stats NZ to encourage everyone to complete the 2023 Census.

So, this is a reminder that you need to return your census forms if you have not done so already.

Census data is used to make important decisions that affect us all. The census is the official count of people living in Aotearoa New Zealand, and everyone who was in the country on Census Day, 7 March 2023, is required by law to complete a census form.

Your participation will help ensure that our community receives funding for services for the number of people that live in our community. That includes education, health, and social services.

To complete the census, you can do it online at <u>www.census.govt.nz</u> using one of the access codes provided in the letters sent to your household. Or you can fill out paper census forms if you have them. To request a new access code or paper forms, freephone 0800 236 787 (0800 CENSUS) or order online at <u>www.census.govt.nz</u>.

The 2023 Census closes on 30 June, so you should do them online now or as soon as practicable. Ensure your paper forms are posted so they arrive with Stats NZ by 30 June.

Census collectors are no longer visiting households providing help to complete census forms (except in the cyclone-impacted areas of the Far North, Te Tairāwhiti, and Hawke's Bay). If you need assistance or more information:

• You can attend a census support event and get face-to-face help to complete forms (for more information go to <u>www.census.govt.nz/census-support</u>).

• We encourage you to help whānau, friends, and neighbours complete their forms.

• There is information in New Zealand Sign Language, Braille, Easy Read, Large Print, and Audio formats, as well as in 29 different languages at <u>www.census.govt.nz</u>.

The 0800 CENSUS (0800 236 787) helpline will be open until 30 June.

Thank you for your support in making sure our community is accurately represented in the census.
